What HONOR is not:

Blame, criticism,
degradation, derision, disgrace,
debasement, reproach

What HONOR is:

The word “honor” in Greek is
timen = to value

To hold in high esteem

To regard as precious; (i.e. gold or silver)

Something weighty or of great substance

Pay to all what is owed to them:

Taxes to whom taxes are owed

Revenue to whom revenue is owed

Respect to whom respect is owed

Honor to whom honor is owed

(Romans 13:7, ESV)

Honor is not earned, it's given

Honor is when you recognize who someone is,
without stumbling over who they are not.

I don't honor people because
THEY are honorable, I honor people because God
tells **ME** to **BE HONORABLE!**

Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God and those that exist have been instituted by God.
(Romans 13:1, ESV)

Therefore, whoever resists the authorities resists
what God has appointed
and those who resist will incur judgment.
(Romans 13:2, ESV)

For rulers are not a terror
to good conduct, but to bad.

Would you have no fear
of the one who is in authority?

Then do what is good and you will receive
His approval.

(Romans 13:3, ESV)

For he is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer.

(Romans 13:4, ESV)

Therefore one must be in subjection,
not only to avoid God's wrath
but also for the sake of conscience.
(Romans 13:5, ESV)

For because of this you also pay taxes,
for the authorities are ministers of God,
attending to this very thing.

(Romans 13:6, ESV)

Pay to all what is owed to them;
taxes to whom taxes are owed,
revenue to whom revenue is owed,
respect to whom respect is owed,
honor to whom honor is owed.

Owe no one anything,
except to love each other,
for the one who loves another
has fulfilled the law.

(Romans 13:7-8, ESV)

For the commandments,
“You shall not commit adultery,
You shall not murder,
You shall not steal,
You shall not covet,”
and any other commandment,
are summed up in this word:
“You shall love your neighbor
as yourself.”
(Romans 13:9, ESV)

honoring of this person?

What you honor you can access.

What you honor, you attract.
(What you dishonor moves away from you)

Familiarity kills honor,
celebration gives it life.

He went away from there and came to His hometown and His disciples followed Him. (Mark 6:1, ESV)

And on the Sabbath, He began to teach in the
synagogue and many who heard Him were
astonished, saying,

“Where did this man get these things? What
is the wisdom given to Him?
How are such mighty works
done by His hands?”

(Mark 6:2, ESV)

“Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and
brother of James and Joses
and Judas and Simon?
And are not his sisters here with us?”
And they took offense at Him.
(Mark 6:3, ESV)

And Jesus said to them,
“A prophet is not without honor,
except in his hometown and
among his relatives
and in his own household.”
(Mark 6:4, ESV)

And He could do no mighty work there, except that He laid His hands on a few sick people and healed them.

And He marveled because of their unbelief. And He went about among the villages teaching.”
(Mark 6:5-6, ESV)
