

Courage of Biblical Proportions

“Pioneers of the faith possess a
courage firmly rooted in faith!”

Hebrews 10:35 -11:27

Hebrews 10

35 Therefore do not throw away your confidence, which has a great reward. **36** For you have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God you may receive what is promised.

37 For, “Yet a little while, and the coming one will come and will not delay; **38** but my righteous one shall live by faith, and if he shrinks back, my soul has no pleasure in him.”

39 But we are not of those who shrink back and are destroyed, but of those who have faith and preserve their souls.

Boldness to enter into the presence of God through
Jesus our great high priest,
is closely intertwined with the boldness to live out
a life of faith.

Hebrews 11:1

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.

6 And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

Great courage rests on the shoulders of strong faith — deeply rooted in the knowledge of who God is, what He has spoken and who we are in Christ.

23 By faith Moses, when he was born, was hidden for three months by his parents, because they saw that the child was beautiful, and they were not afraid of the king's edict.

One courageous act can set into motion a series of events through which God demonstrates His mighty power.

24 By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, **25** choosing rather to be mistreated with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin.

26 He considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward.

We can draw courage from the knowledge that
God rewards those who faithfully endure the
trials that test our faith.

27 By faith he left Egypt, not being afraid of the anger of the king, for he endured as seeing Him who is invisible.

Those who live courageously pass on a legacy of courage for the next generation to follow.

By courageously stepping out in obedience to the call of God on your life, you become the answer to someone else's prayer.
